**PRACTICE PROFILE**

The Practice is 99% facial cosmetic surgery with approximately 1% being insurance qualifying procedures. There is no trauma call associated with the practice.

The Institute has a Fellowship in facial cosmetic surgery under the auspices of the American Academy of Facial plastic and Reconstruction Surgery and affiliated with the Indiana University School of Medicine Department of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery. Residents from both the departments of Otolaryngology-Head and Neck Surgery and Dermatology rotate through the practice. The opportunity for clinical teaching appointments is available if desired.



The physicians associated with the facility are actively involved in clinical research and teaching. Clinical research and production of publications is encouraged.

The Practice is a national training center for Botox, Lumenis lasers, Storz endoscopic surgery, Coapt facial implants, and a major liposuction manufacturer. In addition, the practice conducts educational seminars in advanced cosmetic surgical techniques utilizing its clinical conference room which provides board room style seating and real time video – audio feed from the operation rooms in the facility.

## FACILITY

The Institute is divided into a clinical practice section, and educational research section, and an ambulatory surgery recovery care section. At the present time the facility is expanding to add a medical spa to the practice. This will not only expand the skin rejuvenation aspects of the practice but would also be anticipated to provide a significant referral source to the cosmetic practice and vice versa.



The facility is a 16,000 square foot, free standing building with the ability to expand as needed. It is located on the major thoroughfare that runs through the middle of Indianapolis and is located directly across the street from one of the city's major hospitals.

The clinical practice section contains two consultation suites with video imaging and advanced multimedia as well as patient care coordinator interview area. Four large patient examination rooms, private waiting rooms, nurses station and photography area highlight the clinical section. A large "beauty room" is located in the clinical area for make up consultations and "touch ups" following procedures.

Physician offices, administrative support offices and the clinical conference room are located in the research-conferencing section.



The facility also consists of an ambulatory surgery center with recovery care suites, all directly accessible within the facility.

The surgery center consists of two large operating rooms which include TV monitors and TV cameras mounted in the surgical lights which can be directly operated from the conference room and provide both direct feed and video taping capabilities. There is also a treatment room which is used for laser surgery and minor cases.

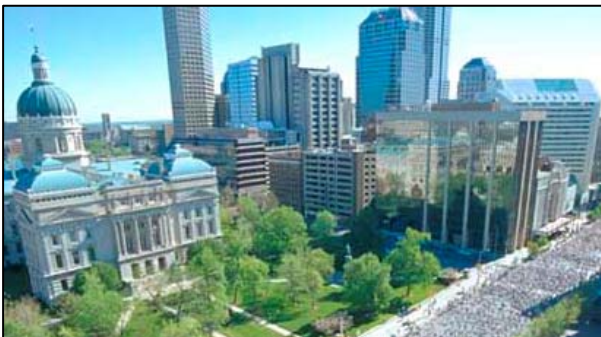


In addition to the PACU there are four well-appointed recovery care suites. Patients are able to convalesce overnight with a physician and nurse staffing the facility at all times a patient is present. Physician coverage is provided by Fellows and Residents who staff the facility in the evening and at night. All patients are monitored with full telemetry capabilities similar to an intensive care unit with data being projected on slave monitors located throughout the facility to allow close scrutiny by physicians. No nurse anesthetists are utilized; so all anesthesia is provided by board certified anesthesiologists. The facility is licensed by the Indiana Department of Health, Medicare Certified, and fully accredited by the Accreditation for Ambulatory Healthcare (AAAHC).

## INDIANAPOLIS



Indianapolis has a metropolitan population of approximately 1.2 million and is considered one of the most progressive cities in the nation. It serves as the tertiary care center for much of the state, since it is the host of the state's only medical school.

The city has recently built the Conceco Field House for the Pacers and is in the process of developing a new domed stadium for the Colts. A world class zoo, symphony, art museum and the world's largest childrens' museum make Indianapolis a destination location for many social and entertainment activities. Long touted as the sports racing capital of the world, the city hosts the Indianapolis 500, the Brickyard 500, and the Formula One Grand Prix in addition to the National Drag Racing championships each year.

Indianapolis' central location provides easy access to Chicago which is only a 30 minute flight away as well as Cincinnati and Louisville which are within 2 ½ hours driving time.

The city has a diverse economic base in business, manufacturing, and agriculture. It is the world headquarters for Eli Lilly Pharmaceuticals, Anthem (the nation's largest health insurance provider), Thompson Consumer Electronics (formerly RCA), Guidant, and Roche Diagnostics.



Carmel is a suburb located on the north side of Indianapolis within 30 minutes drive of the Indianapolis International Airport. It has the highest per capita income for the state and is one of the fastest growing communities in the United States.

Indianapolis has an excellent medical community with one of the most active medical societies in the country. Fifteen hospitals are located in the metropolitan area including six specialty hospitals and over 20 surgery centers.
